# Visit from Richard Fuller MP

On Friday 8th October, Richard Fuller MP will be visiting the school to speak to the children about their ideas regarding the fight against climate change. A letter was passed on to me in July about the COP26 Glasgow from 1st –12th November 2021. The UK is hosting the UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26). This is an important event and the UK is committed to fulfilling the commitments made at the Paris Agreement.

The goal of COP26 is to accelerate progress in five shared Challenges of Climate Change:

- Adaptation and resilience to help communities to prepare for the worst impacts of climate change
- Nature to safeguard and restore natural habitats and ecosystems to preserve the planet's biodiversity
- Energy transitions to accelerate the clean energy transition through cheaper renewables and storage
- Clean Transport to clean our air by speeding up the global transitions to zero emission vehicles
- Finance to encourage our financial systems to be cleaner to unlock growth and create green jobs

As our local Member of Parliament and as a member of the Business and Energy Select Committee which has been scrutinising the government's preparations for COP26, he has a special interest in ensuring that all schools in his constituency have the opportunity to make a contribution and inspire others.

We plan to work on a project alongside the children and staff from Wilden CE Primary School to share their ideas about how the two schools are planning to make a difference to our community and planet. He will visit each school and hear presentations from some of the children and view their work. Parents will also have the opportunity to visit the school to see the work completed.

### **COVID Arrangements**

As we start the new academic year, the guidance from the Department of Education has been updated to reflect the national picture. The latest guidance makes clear that the vast majority of restrictions in schools should now be lifted and that schools should return (where appropriate) to as normal a daily routine as possible.

The arrangements for drop off and collection will be as follows:

- All children will now come into school at the same time as each other from 8:45am. Registers will close at 8:55am.
- All children from Years 1 to 6 will come in through the MUGA gate. The children can be sent through the gate by their parents and walk straight to their classrooms. There will be a TA to meet and help the KS1 children.
- Nursery will come through the gate next to the school building and go straight into the Nursery classroom with their parents where they will meet Mrs Deane.
- Reception children will come through the same gate and walk to the back playground with their parents where they will meet Mrs Brown.
- At the end of the day (3:15pm), Nursery and Reception parents will wait at the gate next to the school building. Teachers will send the children to their parents at the gate when they see them.
- Years 1 to 6 will be taken to the MUGA by their teacher. They will line up on the MUGA in class lines. Parents will come onto the MUGA to collect their children.
- If parents have children in Nursery/Reception and an older year group, they should collect Nursery/Reception children first.

Additionally, children in Years 1-6 will continue to attend school in their PE kit on days that they are timetabled for PE. Children are expected to wear correct PE kit and 'alternative' clothing will not be acceptable.
